Apprenticeship Montgomery offers motivated individuals a clear, focused, and affordable path to future educational and employment success.

ABOUT

Eligible applicants have the opportunity to enroll tuition-free in Montgomery Community College courses that lead to a certificate, diploma, or degree, as well as provide entry-level job skills.

Participating employers commit to pay all associated costs for their apprentices' education.

HOW IT WORKS

Apprentices are placed with employers in jobs, shadowing positions until they are eligible to work as operators. At the end of the program, successful apprentices will have earned the following credentials:

A college-level certificate in Electrical Systems Technology

A Journeyman's (Apprenticeship) credential

An Associate of Applied Science Degree in Industrial Systems Technology

***Workplace experience hours will vary based on company**

The Industrial Systems Technology Apprenticeship Pathway is designed to prepare individuals to safely service, maintain, repair, and install equipment.
